## IDEA 48 Why media literacy is important for Indianapolis young people: The relationship between media literacy and personal efficacy, and between media literacy and personal violence

The major reason why media literacy is important for young people is that it will help them *understand the human communication process*. Support by our *OpportunINDY* initiative for "Communication and Media Literacy" education is needed because:

 media literacy helps young people understand theories and practical application of interpersonal communications with family, friends, teachers, co-workers, and strangers through effective listening and speaking skills.

What is vital, our *OpportunINDY* has to see the relationship between media literacy and personal efficacy, and between media literacy and personal violence so that mis-understandings/mis-communications do not lead to the "angry quarrels" mentioned above by Mr. McNeil.
