O. Snethen was elected president of the Indianapolis Federation of Community Civic Clubs at a meeting held Saturday night at the Chamber of Commerce building. Other officers elected were: A. Leroy Porteus, first vice president; L. L. Fellows, second vice president, and John F. White, secretary-treasurer.</p> <p>Mr. Snethen is a member of the Mapleton Civic Association. Mr. Porteus belongs to the Brookside Civic League. Mr. Fellows, College Avenue Civic Association, and Mr. White, Southeastern Civic Improvement Club.</p> <p>Members of the executive committee named included Mr. Snethen, Mr. Porteus, Mr. Fellows, Mr. White, W. M. Swain of the Parkview Boulevard As-</p>	<p>sociation, A. Stephen Fuller of the Enterprise Civic League, W. J. Cramer of the North Central Civic Association, E. S. Moore of the Northeastern Community League, Sam W. Inglo of the Brightwood Civic League, and C. E. Paul of the East Side Civic League.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Thirty-Five Present.</b></p> <p>Twelve civic leagues and associations were represented at the meeting. The by-laws of the federation were presented for final reading and were approved. More than thirty-five were present at the meeting.</p> <p>Following the election of officers and adoption of by-laws, Mr. Fuller, chairman of the street car committee, reported that the investigations and deliberations of the committee, named by Mayor Shank to go over the street car problems of the city, had not been completed and no report could be made public at this time.</p> <p>The federation went on record as endorsing the move of the Brightwood Civic League to have the city take over for park purposes about 150 acres of land north of Brightwood, lying between Thirtieth and Thirty-fourth streets. The matter of investigating what steps should be taken to place the matter before the attention of the park board and what should be done to co-operate with the Brightwood Civic League was referred to the committee on parks.</p> <p>P. H. Simmons, vice president of the Mapleton Civic Association and presi-</p>	<p>dent of the Mutual Realty Corporation, a subsidiary organization of the Mapleton Civic Association, explained briefly to the federation the plan of operating the subsidiary organization in the interests of the Mapleton community.</p> <p>Mrs. Edward Donnell spoke at the meeting in behalf of the Russian famine relief fund, and urged the members of the federation to back the move to feed starving people in the Volga district of Russia.</p> <p>The next meeting of the federation will be held Thursday night, March 23.</p> <h2 style="text-align: center;">PLAN NEW APARTMENTS</h2> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Meridian Street Building Will Contain 48 Suites at Moderate Rentals.</b></p> <p>Two real estate transactions, involving the same property were completed Saturday assuring the construction at once of a modern apartment building to contain forty-eight suites of three rooms each, the announcement being made yesterday.
