

**URGE COLORED SANITARIUM**

**Civic Club Federation Submits Resolutions Favoring Tuberculosis Care Facilities.**

Resolutions recommending the extension of facilities at the county tuberculosis sanitarium at Sunnyside, or elsewhere, for the care of colored tubercular patients, both as a humanitarian policy and to safeguard the city, were transmitted to the board of county commissioners yesterday by the Indianapolis Federation of Civic Clubs.

The resolutions were recently adopted after an investigation made by the federation committee on schools, which revealed that a majority of the tubercular cases were emanating in congested colored districts.

"Because of congested housing conditions among the colored people it is practically impossible for tubercular patients to be cared for in the homes without endangering the health of other members of the family," said the resolution.

**Many Deaths Result.**

"The public schools have a large number of colored children in incipient stages of tuberculosis due to this cause and this situation in itself should awaken wide interest," another paragraph read.

The resolutions added that statistics given out by colored citizens recently revealed that one-fourth of the deaths in this city are among the colored people. It was pointed out that for years the Marion County Tuberculosis Society has emphasized the care of incurable consumptives among the colored population as Indianapolis' greatest social need.

The board of county commissioners is expected to take action on the resolutions at the next regular meeting. The federation will urge co-operation with other health and school authorities, it was said.
