School: Forestview City: Niagara Falls, Ontario Grade: 6, 7

A "Me to We Club" focuses on giving back to the community. While the students collect food for the local food bank (WE SCARE Hunger Campaign), they also help those affected by Poverty and share what we have learned with our whole community.

Project title: The Poverty Project

School: Jack Hulland Elementary City: Whitehorse, Yukon Grade: 6, 7

Students study issues that surround poverty and to learn how to act for social change. Students speak with elders about their stories and thoughts on poverty issues. Students also research people's thoughts on poverty by checking out stories from a variety of cultures. Students weaved stories together to better understand the complex landscape of poverty.

Project title: Keep the Promise

School: St. Leonard Catholic City: Manotick, Ontario Grade: 6

Students held a community event to raise awareness of child poverty in Manotick and Canada. Funds were raised to purchase items for "shoe boxes" that are filled with items low-income children need. The "shoe boxes" are made 3/year: Christmas, March Break and summer break.

Project title: Poverty Awareness and Education

School: Mary Queen of Peace *City:* St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador *Grade:* 6 Students learn about poverty and how it impacts St. John's. Students worked with Citizen's Voice, a solution-based discussion forum for poor people. They visited the Gathering Place, a center building community and providing nourishment. Students worked with groups bringing together government, community, private sectors and the poor to develop solutions together.
