

### HIGH SCHOOL FOR WEST SIDE VOTED BY COMMISSIONERS

Members of Board Decide on Project and Now Seek Location—Issue Long Agitated.

**SHORTRIDGE AIM ALIVE**

**Dr. Haslep Says She Intends to Bring North Side Proposal Up Later.**

Construction of a West side high school, so a site to be selected later, was decided upon last night by the board of school commissioners.

Action of the board in proposing high schools for the West side and the colored children does not mean that construction of a new high school at Thirty-fourth and Meridian streets will be postponed. It was said by commissioners. Dr. Haslep pointed out that she intends to bring the matter up later.
