1. Phillip Zoecher Chair Lawyer For 22 years was a member of the Indiana State Tax Commission. In the 1920s, known for opposing those IPS board members who wanted more taxes for pay for more schools.
2. Mrs. Ralph E. Kennington Vice-chair Chair of the Seventh district of the Indiana Federation of Civic Clubs. Her husband is president of Associated Waste Material Co.
3. John Atherton- financial secretary and later Butler's secretary-treasurer, he looked out for Butler's financial interests. He served on the board and was widely known in Indiana for his civic leadership as a member of the City Planning Commission and the Board of Zoning Appeals for 23 years, where he served as president of both for many years. He served as a state senator in the 1941, 1943 and 1944. His other civic associations included the Arthur Jordan Foundation, the Central Indiana Boy Scouts, the Masonic Lodge, the Columbia Club, Delta Tau Delta, the Rotary Club and Central Christian Church. He married the daughter of Hilton U. Brown.
4. Paul H. Buchanan- President/chairman of the board of Flanner and Buchanan Mortuaries.
5. Richard T. Buchanan- personal secretary of Senator Samuel M. Ralston, writer of the Indianapolis News.
6. B.C. Downey- president of Indiana National Bank
7. Isidore Feibleman- Attorney, senior partner Bamberger & Feibleman, president of Hebrew Congregation, president of the Jewish Welfare Federation.
8. Clinton H. Givan- attorney, superior court judge, Marion county representative to the Indiana General Assembly.
9. Ward Hackleman- president of the Indianapolis Association of Life Underwriters, insurance executive, Dramatic club, Woodstock club, Columbia club, University club, president of Indianapolis Country club, 32nd degree mason, Shrine member, Beta Theta Pi Fraternity.
10. Dr. Alfred Henry- president of the Indianapolis state tuberculosis association, prominent physician, president of Rotary club, Scottish Rite, Murat Shrine.
11. Ms. M.E. Hoagland- New York state library school, spent time organizing libraries in other states, the first state secretary/organizer for the public library commission of Indiana, Vassar club, Woman's City club, Business Woman.
12. Curtis Hodges- newspaper editor, director of the greater national capital committee of the Washington board of trade.
13. Alex R. Holiday- businessmen elite, financed the early athletic building of Butler University, president of the Meridian Hills club.
14. T.C. Howe- New Irvington club, Century club, professor, chairman of the Alumni committee, social elite, Butler University president.
15. Samuel W. Huls- candidate for state representative, attorney, General Savings and Loan Association of Indianapolis director.
16. Charles W. Jewett- Mayor of Indianapolis and attorney
17. R.H. Kenady- board of directors of the Indiana Christian Missionary Association
18. Joseph A. McGowan- president of the Indianapolis Street Railway company/secretary treasurer, civic leader, Rotary club
19. O.E. McMeans- scoutmaster, candidate for clerk treasurer, head of the industrial engineering firm McMeans & Tripp

20. Mrs. Felix T. McWhirter- Indiana Federation of Clubs Chair of Home/Education dept
