What do we mean when we refer to diversity in college?

Often when we speak of diversity, which is simply defined as "variety", what we mean is multiculturalism, or the acceptance of individuals of different ethnicities, races, cultures, beliefs and *economic backgrounds* (emphasis mine). When most students seek diversity on campus, what they are actually looking for are opportunities to express themselves and find community with others who believe the same way, as well as opportunities to learn from those from different backgrounds and cultures.

Amount of Financial Assistance by Income Level

The chart below shows scholarship and grant distributions by income for freshmen getting any sort of federally-funded Title IV aid, which includes Federal PLUS loans.

| Income Level | Percent of Freshman | Average Assistance |
|-----------------|---------------------|--------------------|
| Income 0-30k | 18.2% | \$14,234 |
| Income 30k-48k | 10.5% | \$12,921 |
| Income 48k-75k | 12.8% | \$8,231 |
| Income 75k-110k | 13.1% | \$3,321 |
| Income 110k + | 13.6% | \$1,835 |

Title IV Aid

***64.0% (13, 911) of IUPUI students get grant aid averaging \$9,517**

The table above displays students who are receiving Title IV aid which is federal assistance from the government in the form of loans, grants or work-study.
