Jews at Harvard tripled to 21% of the freshman class in 1922 from about 7% in 1900 Lowell argued that cutting the number of Jews at Harvard to a maximum of 15% would be good for the Jews, because limits would prevent further anti-Semitism. Harvard Pres. Lowell reasoned, "The anti-Semitic feeling among the students is increasing, and it grows in proportion to the increase in the number of Jews. If their number should become 40% of the student body, the race feeling would become intense."
